



International Sponsorship

Once you decide to grow your business internationally, you might wonder if it's necessary to sign up for International Sponsorship. Here is some information about International Sponsorship that will help you understand how it works:

Regions

The Isagenix® global market is divided into regions. There are two regions currently:

Region 10: U.S., Canada and Mexico

Region 20: Taiwan, Hong Kong, Australia, New Zealand and Singapore

Malaysia will be region 20 once the business opens, and China will be region 30, a new region, once the business opens.

When do you need international sponsorship?

If you want to enroll someone in another country, it does not mean that you need an International Sponsorship; as an Isagenix Associate, you can sponsor anyone in the world!

However, your team volume from another region only accumulates if you have an International Sponsorship. For example, if you are in Canada and your downline is in Taiwan, you will get your personal volume regardless of which region you purchase products from, as well as the personal enrolled volume, without the International Sponsorship. But, in order to accumulate your team volume from another region, an International Sponsorship is needed.

Regardless where you purchase from, it's important to understand if your downline is building business in other regions, and if that's the case, it may work to your advantage to sign up for International Sponsorship.

Key information about international sponsorship:

The annual fee for International Sponsorship is \$49 U.S. and it covers all regions. This means once you are signed up, your team volume will accumulate from all regions.

This is separate from the Annual Associate Fee. Signing up can be done by either calling Customer Care or logging in to your Associate Back Office (ABO), selecting the "Enroll" section on Dashboard and selecting the link entitled "International Sponsorship." Then, simply follow the instructions.
